

Recently there has been some dissatisfaction expressed towards the village council and staff about Bylaw enforcement. The Community Standards Bylaw was passed by village council in an effort to maintain safety and esthetic standards of the village. This bylaw is not intended to unnecessarily infringe of the rights of property owners, but to facilitate the continued use and enjoyment of all properties. In the past, village bylaws have not been enforced due to a variety of circumstances. However, village council felt that bylaw enforcement was an important file to pursue and has contracted with Vegreville to access their bylaw enforcement officers. While no system is perfect, bylaw staff makes a significant effort to work with property owners to ensure compliance with the Bylaws that council has established. At times this process requires measures that may seem unnecessary, but no actions are taken carelessly. In addition, it can be important to consider that bylaws that are not enforced will be ineffective.

WECAN Food Basket Society

About WECAN Food Basket

The WECAN Food Basket Society operates as a "warehouse without walls" – we buy all our food in bulk and distribute it to our community based depots. Volunteers working with local churches, community centres, social service agencies and daycares, staff the depots located throughout the greater Edmonton area. Once a month, volunteer drivers pick up the food from our supplier, The Grocery People Warehouse, and take it to the depots. Our volunteers then count, sort and pack the baskets ready for pick up. Objective is to relieve poverty by operating community based depots to address food security needs of families by providing quality food at a reasonable cost.

The Program: Members prepay for their food baskets by the first Friday of each month by dropping their orders in the book return at the Tofield Municipal Library, 5407-50 St.. The payment must be in cash and in a sealed envelope. On the front of the envelope, put the date, your name and phone number (cell phone number preferred), your

order, and the total cash amount in the envelope. Members then pick up their orders on the third or fourth Thursday of the month at Bardo Lutheran Church, 4737-57 Ave., between 4 and 6 pm.

What do I get in a WECAN Food Basket Order? Fresh food is the staple of any healthy diet. Our food basket offers 3 cuts of frozen meat, 3 types of fresh vegetables and 3 kinds of seasonal fruit every month, along with helpful recipes to prepare healthy meals. Meat Orders are \$15 and produce orders are \$10. Membership is \$5 and lasts until March 2018. PLEASE NOTE: Food orders that are not picked up will not be refunded. WECAN reserves the right to sell unclaimed baskets or distribute them to families in need.
