Trees and Grass

Trimming Trees: Residents are responsible to trim their trees to be within the bounds of their own property. This applies to back alleys, trees hanging over the sidewalk, and trees hanging over your neighbors property. Help the Village walkways stay clear for everyone to use, prune your trees.

Please be courteous to your neighbors to ensure that your trees and shrubbery do not encroach on their property. Neighbor to neighbor disputes are the responsibility of the landowners – they are not the responsibility of the village.

Grass Clippings: As you are all aware, many of our streets cannot be cleaned by the street sweeper. Please do not blow your grass clippings onto the street or alley. They decompose, become mud and can plug up the curbs and drainage system. Public works employees have been out hand shoveling the gutters to get them clean. **Please do your part** by NOT filling them will grass cuttings.

GED Preparation – Fall Registration

Beaver County Community Adult Learning Program will be hosting a **GED PREPARATION** course offered by *Academic Express Adult Education and Training*. Apply now for September to ensure you have a spot. An interview to assess program suitability and eligibility for financial aid is required. We have a limit of 10 students per session. **Dates:** September 19 to November 30, 2017

Time: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday from 5:00 to 8:00 pm

Place: Beaver County Service Centre - 5120 50 Street, Ryley, AB

The **GED** is a **High School Equivalency Diploma**, and is recognized by many employers throughout Alberta. The **GED Preparation** class is a 100 hour video conferenced class that prepares you to challenge the **GED Exam**. The program consists of 5 subjects – Social Studies, Science, Math, English Literature and Grammar, and an essay. All 5 subjects must be passed in order to receive the **GED Diploma** from **Alberta Education**. There is an on-site instructor to assist you with your learning during class times.

This program is conditional upon Government of Alberta funding. Student Financial Aid is available through a Part -time Studies Grant if you fall within the income threshold for eligibility.
