Mayors Message

I bring you greetings on behalf of Village Council and hope that you're all still going strong with the same high hopes for an early spring as we are. Council has been busy in the month of February attending meetings and seminars and gathering good information that will be useful in the coming years of this term. On the 22nd of February, Council met and reviewed the results of the Public Input Survey in depth and had good discussion about what the public had to say. This was part of a larger meeting where Council members began working on their strategic plan together with administration and Russell Farmer Consulting. We believe that the survey results from the public will be the driving force behind how the Village Strategic Plan takes shape, and will release a summary of what we heard from the public in the near future, along with a draft of the strategic plan which will be accompanied by a request for public feedback on the document.

Also in the month of February, we applied for a collaboration grant, and a community partnership grant to help us cover the cost of creating a municipal development plan, a statutory planning document that the Province has made mandatory for all municipalities to have. We hope our applications are successful, and will let the public know the results. Also speaking of grants, we were pleased to receive our \$50,000 from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities for our infrastructure audit and 10-year capital plan, which will form the backbone of capital budget discussions moving forward, for this council and others to come after it. As we get into planning talks, it has become clear that there is a need for long-term planning in Ryley and we're taking steps to ensure one is in place prior to the end of our term in office. This will include many opportunities for public engagement along the way, as part of this Council's commitment to transparency and openness.

During early March, Council will begin working on the 2018 budget, as part of a three-year operating budget plan under new requirements from the Province. Once again, priorities identified in the public input survey will be used to help guide budget discussions as Council works to improve future prospects for the Village.

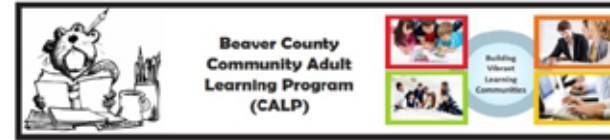

George's Harness & Saddlery still tall in the saddle

Founded by the late George Knudslien, George's Harness & Saddlery carries on after 40 years with son Morley Knudslien in Ryley. Originally starting off as a horseshoe repair business on the family farm, the Knudslien's business moved to Ryley a few decades ago and expanded

into harness and saddle making, as well as other tack accessories. Known across western Canada for quality, handmade authentic products, son Morley says part of the longstanding success of the business is owed to carrying on with traditional leatherworking tools and techniques.

"My father had an extensive collection of old tools that we still use today for making our products. Over the years many harness and saddlery businesses closed down, and the equipment and knowledge was lost, but my father was sure to pass what he knew on, and we're still making things the old fashioned way today," Morley said.

The family business has shipped products as far away as

Norway and Australia. Morley himself originally worked as a mechanic and also ran a business selling tools before he decided he wanted to be closer to home. While he was looking at changing careers, he came to work with his father in the harness business and came to love it. He's been doing it ever since. Other products besides riding gear has included leather briefcases and leather canteens.

The business has benefited from the presence of long time employee Jason Lusk, who has been with the company for 25 years, starting as a work experience student back in high school. Morley's wife, Lorraine, and her son Mark also work for the business. As Morley's daughters grew up, they would also spend hours in the shop after school working the trade. "It was very nice to have a place my girls could come after school and work. It made owning a business in Ryley enjoyable," Morley said.

Apart from horse owners, Morley's authenticity is sought after by museum curators who need his expertise to create duplicates of historic saddles and harnesses, which has included replica saddles for the Northwest Mounted Police Museum in Fort Saskatchewan, as well as dogsled harness work for the Dunvegan historic site in northwest Alberta.
