

Mayors Message

Hello everyone, March is finally behind us and warmer weather is on the way – we've made it through another Alberta winter. As things warm up around the region, so does the pace of Council. At the March 27 regular council meeting, Council approved both the 2018 Operating and Capital budgets, as well as a number of supporting reports that were used by Council in making budget decisions. Administration is in the process of preparing a budget report to illustrate how Village revenues and expenses are earned, managed and accounted for. We expect it to be released towards the end of April, and will be placing it on the Village of Ryley website for public review.

Some of the highlights of the 2018 Operating Budget include:

- Projected operating revenues of \$1,089,050
- Projected operating expenditures of \$1,089,045
- Service levels for recreation to be maintained at the current standard
- Approval for installation of dedicated Wi-Fi at the **Ryley Community Hall**
- Funding of \$20,000 for the Business Tax Rebate Program for local businesses

- Continued support for community groups in the form of donations and subsidized hall rental rates for non-profit groups upon request

- A one-time grant of \$15,000 to the Ryley Firefighters Society to assist in training requirements

- A reduction in Bylaw patrols during spring and summer months from weekly to bi-weekly intervals

- Funding for Council in the amount of \$5,000 for public engagement practices

- 2% salary adjustment for permanent staff excluding the CAO totaling \$4,047

- A reduction in summer student employment from 2 to 1, commencing in June and terminating at the end of August

- A 50% reduction in minimum tax levels from \$500 to \$250 per assessable property

- An estimated 15% overall reduction in the combined municipal tax levy from \$501,987 to \$424,000. (Please note individual tax reductions may vary from property to property)

Selected capital projects this year include the following:

- Sanitary sewer inspections estimated at \$30,000 for

areas identified in the MPE infrastructure report.

- New sand for the Lions Community Playground as identified in the 2017 playground inspection report as a top priority, estimated at \$5,000

- Phase I & II Environmental testing of Lots 2, 3PUL and Lot 4, all in Block 1, Plan 1820709, estimated at \$30,000

- Area Structure Plan for Lots 2, 3PUL and Lot 4, all in Block 1, Plan 1820709, pending results of environmental testing, estimated at \$10,000

- Total capital budget spending for the following projects is \$75,000

Council has also made the decision based on the results of the 2018 Public Input Survey to submit a letter to the Minister of Municipal Affairs requesting consideration for a Viability Screening. In order to complete this, Administration completed a Self-Assessment Questionnaire provided by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and reviewed the results with Council at the Strategic Planning meeting in February. While the general results trended towards viability (87 viable, 37 non-viable responses), in respect of those who wished for more information, or a more definitive answer as to whether Ryley has a viability issue, Council feels the request to the Minister will provide opportunity for a third party to assess the situation and make a recommendation. A copy of the letter to the Minister is available to anyone who wishes to review it.

Council is near completion of a draft strategic plan. which will also be made available to the public once complete. I would like to thank everyone in the community once again who participated in the Public Input Survey, as the results were instrumental in developing priorities for Council over the next four years.

Lastly, a debt of gratitude to the ministry of municipal affairs, as we have received two grants for two important projects this year; the creation of a Municipal Development Plan (\$19,400), and Collaboration Coaching for members of Council (50% matching grant up






BMS. "All these skills really help in my work." From Kelly's perspective, customer service is a significant part of her job. "But my customers work for BMS," she says.

With a focus on customer service – along with the acquisition of new business, recruiting new employees and operating safely and efficiently – the 61 full – and part-time employees of BMS have turned the organization since 2011 into a source of community pride as well as financial stability. In six years, revenues have more than tripled, to \$22 million, while debt has been eliminated. BMS now distributes \$2 million a year to the communities under which it operates, and its employees receive an annual bonus equivalent to five per cent to 37.5 per cent fo their basic pay.

Alberta's TOP 70 EMPLOYERS **2018 WINNERS Beaver Municipal Solutions turns** surplus into benefit

When Pierre Breau became General Alberta's Manager of Beaver Municipal Solutions (BMS) in the village of Ryley, Alta., he knew that the surrounding community could prosper from its singular endowment: it sits on one of the largest and most impervious clay soil structures in Canada,



which makes it an ideal location for BMS's landfill site.

For almost 20 years, the five communities responsible for overseeing BMS had delegated its operations to a third party. After the contract expired, the organization's community overseers gave Breau the mandate to make BMS profitable, not just for its own sake, but for the communities and the employees as well.



In addition to serving about 10,000 residents and businesses around Beaver County, BMS provides waste management services for Edmonton's Capital Region, about 85 Km to the west. It also provides advanced waste treatment, recycling and remediation technologies to municipal and industrial customers.

"It's a competitive business," says Breau, an engineer who has more than three decades fo experience in public works and infrastructure.

Jeannine Kelly first heard of BMS through a friend at the 4H Club. As Administrative Assistant - Mechanical and Parts, Kelly spent two weeks learning to use the organization's enterprise software system to order and keep track of parts and services for BMS's compactors, dozers, graders, semis and other equipment.

"I'm interested in cars and trucks, I have a passion for software, and I'm really organized," says Kelly, who will soon complete her first year with
