4. New Business:

- a) Clean Harbors Update:
 - 1. Stan reported that three people form Alberta Environment were out last week and they advised that everything is in order and there is no action required at the site.
 - 2. Clean Harbors needs to convert the reports they get from the monitoring stations into lay terms, so that they can sent updates to the public.
 - 3. The village has received the first ½ payment along with the \$75,000 grant funding cheque.
 - 4. They will be a little under budget for the first ½.
 - 5. They are having to spray the loads down because of wind.
 - 6. The grass on the south slope is coming they plan to cap the rest of the south slope this fall.
 - 7. They are looking at having an Open House.
 - 8. Is Earth Academy the responsibility of Clean Harbors? Stan says yes. They will help out by redoing the sign at Earth Academy this summer

\$75,000 grant expenditure requests:
13 new submissions for funding were received. MOTION 2015-06-1 by Cr. Stan Yuha that the CHCRC recommend to council, that the funds be distributed as follows:

In addition:

- 1. \$10,000 is to be invested in a separate account, designated to be used to build up a fund that could be matched from village funds, to have walking paths build in the future. The intent is to annually put this sum of money, from the annual \$75,000 fund, into this special account and to have a design drawn up, to see walking paths developed in the future.
- 2. This leaves an additional \$1,500 which could be invested in the walking path account, but if funds are needed sometime throughout the year, the committee could make a recommendation to council for their use.
- 3. The Leadership Team is required to clean and trim the paths, remove some of the deadfall, and clear settings for picnic tables at Academy Park.
