Mayor's Message

Wow! What a Sports Day we had this past June. I have to offer a tremendous thank you to the whole community for the great atmosphere that was present for the Sports Day weekend! Our hardworking community volunteers, staff and Sports Day Committee, parade participants, as well as the local support that came out made it one of the best Sports Days we've had. I certainly hope all the ball teams that came out left with a winning smile if not a winning score by the end of the weekend. I can tell you that Council enjoyed their time serving pancakes at the breakfast and being in the float, it was great to see everyone and we look forward to it next year.

On the Council side of things, we continue to move forward with some long range financial planning. New strategic reserves for roads, sewers and facilities were approved at the June 19 Council meeting, creating dedicated pots of money to fund future construction and repair of important Village infrastructure. As we know from the survey, if not driving the roads themselves, our roads are in need of some TLC, and Council is setting the stage to tackle that issue. Council hopes to be in a position to make contributions to those reserves yearly until a pot of money is large enough to complete some major projects related to sewer replacement and road paving.

Also, Council completed their review of the Thurber reports at the end of May and submitted a statement of concern to Alberta Environment. All in all, the reports do show that Clean Harbors has put in place a solid plan for managing their landfill operation – Council is forwarding Thurber's recommendations to enhance what's already in place to Alberta Environment for consideration in our statement.

As summer gets its stride on, I hope everyone makes some plans to enjoy the sun, and for farmers to enjoy the rain. On behalf of Council I wish you all a Happy Canada Day!


