Mayor's Message

Hello everyone, I'm glad to see such community pride in showing in the condition in which homes and properties are being kept this summer. I've had many comments from people passing through Ryley on what a lovely looking Village we have, and of course those kind words are the result of each resident doing their part to make sure Ryley looks fresh and clean; keep up the good work!

In Council this summer, some major milestones have been reached in so far as the Village has passed a new Master Rates Bylaw, a new Procedural Bylaw, and a new Council Code of Conduct Bylaw. As well, the first reading of the Village's new Land Use Bylaw has been held. From here, Council will be seeking input from the public on what the proposed new Land Use Bylaw looks like. Please keep in mind, this bylaw contains some new provisions relating to Cannabis Production Facilities, which as we know, will be a standard requirement for all municipalities to have, in some measure, some ground rules in place should an application cross the Village's desk for the establishment of a medical cannabis facility, or, on the more controversial side, a recreational cannabis sales facility.

As well, the Village continues working on creating a Municipal Development Plan, which is soon to be a statutory requirement. We have received grant funding to cover the cost of this planning document, but also, I wish to invite a member of the public to sit on the MDP Steering Committee, which will have discussion on long range planning goals and strategies, help facilitate conversations with the public, and ultimately have a hand in the final recommendation to Council on what the document will look like. Applicants are asked to submit a letter of interest to Council for review prior to the next Council meeting on August 7, 2018. Hopefully some interest from the community will spark a few letters, and Council will have some names to pick from.

Lastly, a change in the office is afoot. Council wishes Michael Simpson, the Village's CAO since April of 2017, the best of luck as he takes on a larger role as CAO for the County of Paintearth a little further to the south. Council is grateful for his contribution to the Village for the time we've had him here. In the interim, Council has appointed a locally known interim CAO with

substantial experience in the role, Al Harvey, who will help Council maintain the flow of progress that we've enjoyed as of late with respect to local projects. Council will begin the search for a permanent replacement CAO in coming months.

About WECAN Food Basket

The WECAN Food Basket Society operates as a “warehouse without walls” – we buy all our food in bulk and distribute it to our community based depots. Volunteers staff the depots located throughout the Edmonton and surrounding area. Once a month, volunteer drivers pick up the food from our supplier, The Grocery People Warehouse, and take it to the depots. Our volunteers then count, sort and pack the baskets ready for pick up.

WECAN Mission Statement

The WECAN Food Basket Society provides families and individuals with food security by giving them the opportunity to purchase nutritious food at an affordable price.

The Program in Tofield-Ryley

Members prepay for their food baskets by the first Friday of each month by depositing their order envelope: (Tofield) in the book depository at the Tofield Municipal Library, or (Ryley) in the mail slot at the Village of Ryley Office. Then, orders can be picked up on the third or fourth Thursday of the month (see table at right) at (Tofield) Bardo Lutheran Church, or (Ryley) Ryley Municipal Office.

A WECAN Food Basket consists of...

Fresh food is the staple of any healthy diet. Our food offering is:
Meat Order (\$15): 2-3 cuts of frozen meat,
Produce Order (\$10): 3 types of fresh vegetables and 3 kinds of seasonal fruit



Members can order whatever quantity of each order they would like, for example:
2 produce + 1 meat = \$35 or 2 meat + 1 produce = \$40

Members prepay for their food basket on or by the first Friday of each month. Check Calendar for exceptions to orders and pick up dates.

Membership is \$5 per year: Apr 1 to Mar 31.

Please put your name, phone number and how many meat and produce orders you would like along with the cost on the front of the envelope. We encourage you to use your unused utility bill envelopes. RECYCLE!

The Ryley Seventh-day Adventist Church would like to thank Clean Harbors and the Village Council for the \$3000 donation to support the Depression and Anxiety Recovery Program which was from April 9 to May 28. There were 11 participants. Due to the donation the participants did not have to pay the \$250 fee to take the program therefore money was not a barrier for anyone wishing to participate. At the beginning of the program each participant is given a test to determine what their level of depression and anxiety is; it also indicates what contributing factors are in their life. The same test is given again after they have completed the program. The average depression level of the group at the beginning of the program was 11.5 and at the end it was 3.3 which is a 71% drop in the average depression level of the group. There was a 17% drop in the anxiety level.

If all goes as planned the Ryley Seventh-day Adventist Church will be offering this program again in October/November.

Trees and Grass

Trimming Trees: Residents are responsible to trim their trees to be within the bounds of their own property. This applies to back alleys, trees hanging over the sidewalk, and trees hanging over your neighbors property. Help the Village walkways stay clear for everyone to use, prune your trees.
