Sewer Don'ts

Lately the village office has been receiving many calls from residents with sewer issue. On almost every occasion the issue has been due to certain items and liquids being flushed or poured in the household. Here is a list of some of the items and liquids that you should NOT flush in the toilet or pour down your drains: Food scraps, meat fats, lard, cooking oil, butter and margarine, sauces, shortening, fats, oils or grease from cars or lawnmowers, coffee grinds, egg shells, produce stickers, chunks of garbage, **feminine hygiene products (disposable or non-disposable), paper towels**, flushable cat litter, rags, condoms, motor oil, transmission fluids, anti-freeze or other toxic chemicals, solvents, paints, turpentine, nail polish, polish remover, flammable or explosive substances, corrosive substances that are either acidic or caustic, prescription and over-the-counter medications.

Improper disposal of fats, oils, and grease by residents can build up in the sewer system and cause blockages. This can result in sewer backup, property damages, and cost to residents.

Grease sticks to the insides of sewer pipes (both on your property and in the streets). Over time, the grease can build up and block the entire pipe. Commercial additives, including detergents, that claim to dissolve grease may pass grease down the line and cause problems in other areas.

- Scrape grease and food scraps from trays, plates, pots, pans, utensils, and grills and cooking surfaces into a can or the trash for disposal.

- Put baskets/strainers in sink drains to catch food scraps and other solids, and empty the drain baskets/strainers into the trash for disposal.

If you are having issues with backups your first call should be to a plumber then you need to notify the village. If you have any questions please contact the village office during office hours at 780-663-3653. Thank you!

Large Item Pick-Up

Monday, October 29th

Beaver Municipal Solutions large item pick-up is a no charge service to the communities that BMS provides. Residents will be responsible to place their large items on the FRONT street by the curb (not on grass or boulevard) the evening prior to the municipality's date as listed above. Items should be placed at least 3 feet (1 meter) away from parked vehicles.

Collection Date: Monday, October 29

Freon products such as freezers, fridges, water coolers, etc. must be identified with a BMS sticker in order to be collected. Residents are required to pay \$25 per item with Freon, at either the Village Office or at the BMS Office in order to obtain their sticker. Once payment has been made, a sticker will be provided that needs to be placed either on the front or side of the appliance.

Acceptable Items: Mattresses, couches, recliners, white goods & appliances, tires, and propane tanks.

Unacceptable Items: The following items are not accepted as part of the Large Item Pick-Up Program. Grass clippings, trees, tree branches – can be taken to any of the Transfer Stations or the public drop off area at Ryley. Large chunks of cement/concrete – must be taken to the landfill. Bags of garbage – can be placed in your neighborhood waste bin. Small items that would fit in your neighborhood waste bin.

Electronic waste – can be taken to Viking and Lindbrook Transfer Stations or the public drop off area at Ryley year-round.

If your items have not been picked up three days after your scheduled pick up date, please call our office at 780-663-2038, extension 102.

About WECAN Food Basket

The WECAN Food Basket Society operates as a "warehouse without walls" – we buy all our food in bulk and distribute it to our community based depots. Volunteers staff the depots located throughout the Edmonton and surrounding area. Once a month, volunteer drivers pick up the food from our supplier, The Grocery People Warehouse, and take it to the depots. Our volunteers then count, sort and pack the baskets ready for pick up.

WECAN Mission Statement

The WECAN Food Basket Society provides families and individuals with food security by giving them the opportunity to purchase nutritious food at an affordable price.

The Program in Tofield-Ryley

Members prepay for their food baskets by the first Friday of each month by depositing their order envelope: (Tofield) in the book depository at the Tofield Municipal Library, or (Ryley) in the mail slot at the Village of Ryley Office. Then, orders can be picked up on the third or fourth Thursday of the month (see table at right) at (Tofield) Bardo Lutheran Church, or (Ryley) Ryley Municipal Office.

A WECAN Food Basket consists of...

Fresh food is the staple of any healthy diet. Our food offering is:
Meat Order (\$15): 2-3 cuts of frozen meat,
Produce Order (\$10): 3 types of fresh vegetables and 3 kinds of seasonal fruit



Members can order whatever quantity of each order they would like, for example:
2 produce + 1 meat = \$35 or 2 meat + 1 produce = \$40

Members prepay for their food basket on or by the first Friday of each month. Check Calendar for exceptions to orders and pick up dates.

Membership is \$5 per year: Apr 1 to Mar 31.

Earlier this month, The Beaver Foundation, which operates seniors housing in this small rural community, passed a motion to approve prescribed cannabis smoking. The decision is definitely novel for Albertan communities, but not unprecedented. Cannabis use among seniors continues to grow and has been linked to major health benefits."

Beaver Foundation provides well-maintained, affordable and adequate housing accommodation and care for seniors and low-income individuals, through the operation of 4 lodges and 5 self-contained facilities. The Beaver Foundation facilities are located within Beaver County, which include The Town of Tofield, Village of Ryley, The Village of Holden and The Town of Viking.

Beaver Foundation is one of the few Management bodies that has retained smoking rooms within 2 of the lodges it operates, Holden Lodge and Vialta Lodge in Viking. Although both lodges currently allow smoking in the designated indoor smoke rooms, only Holden Lodge will be approved for smoking and vaping use of medical Marijuana. Once legislation is approved on October 17th, 2018, Holden lodge smoke room will allow non-prescribed marijuana use in the designated smoke room.

The village of Holden is conveniently located 30 minutes from four hospitals and provides many in-house services.
