Public smoking or vaping of cannabis

As of October 17, 2018, Albertans 18 years of age and older are now allowed to smoke or vape cannabis in certain areas.

Citizens are responsible for following important federal and provincial rules applying to the legal and responsible use of cannabis.

In an effort to protect children and limit second-hand exposure, public smoking or vaping of cannabis in Alberta will be prohibited from any place where tobacco smoking is restricted, as well as additional areas. Here is a comprehensive list of prohibited areas for your reference:

- Public buildings/enclosed areas
- Building common areas
- Group living facilities
- Outdoor bus or taxi shelters
- Licensed premises and restaurants
 - Workplaces
 - Hotels
 - Hospital/school/childcare facility property

In or within 5 metres of: outdoor theatres, outdoor pools, splash parks and skating rinks, skateboard or bicycle parks, playgrounds, from sports or playing fields, a doorway/window/air intake of a public building, enclosed area or a workplace

From any motor vehicles, with the exception of those being used as a temporary residences, such as a parked RV

To report an illegal use of cannabis, contact your local RCMP.

Proposed bylaw to adopt the Equity Industrial Park ASP and proposed bylaws to amend the IDP, MDP, LUB

Proposed Bylaw #18-1063 is a bylaw that proposes to adopt an updated Equity Industrial Park Area Structure Plan (EIP ASP) in Beaver County. The purpose of the EIP ASP is to provide a future vision, development objectives and policy direction to establish the logical expansion of the EIP.

As part of the EIP ASP update process in Beaver County, the County is also amending applicable portions of the Ryley-Beaver Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP), the County Municipal Development Plan (MDP) and the County Land Use Bylaw (LUB) to ensure alignment. The Municipal Government Act outlines the need for these statutory plans to be consistent with one another.

Beaver County Council has passed 1st reading to these bylaws (#18-1061, #18-1062, #18-1063 and #18-1064). The Village of Ryley Council has passed 1st reading to the same Ryley-Beaver IDP bylaw (#2018-09-24). The proposed amendments to the Ryley-Beaver IDP and MDP include minor text and map amendments to align with the proposed EIP ASP policy areas.

The proposed amendments to the LUB include two (2) new land use districts with new permitted and discretionary uses, text and map amendments to align with the proposed EIP ASP policy areas.
