

National Flag of Canada Day

On February 15, 1965, our national flag was raised for the first time on Parliament Hill. On the same day in 1996, National Flag of Canada Day was declared. Every year since, we celebrate our beautiful flag on February 15. Canada's flag is a symbol that unites all Canadians equality, diversity and inclusion.

Take this opportunity to honour our iconic flag. Let's celebrate the #CanadianFlag in communities across the country!

Did vou know - National Flaa of Canada

 National Flag of Canada Day was officially proclaimed on February 15, 1996.

• Canada is the only country with a maple leaf on its flag.

• The maple leaf has been used historically as a decorative and ornamental symbol in Canadian art, medals, badges and coat of arms. It has often served to distinguish Canadians abroad.

• The stylized maple leaf on the flag has eleven points. • Red and white were proclaimed Canada's official colours in the proclamation of the Royal Arms of Canada in 1921 by King George V.

• The Canadian flag is twice as long as it is wide. The white square and its maple leaf make up half the surface of the flag equal to the two red bars combined. Vexillologists (flag experts) often cite the National Flag of Canada as one of the world's most beautiful based on its compelling design and measured use of colour.

• Every province and territory in Canada has its own flag. The one symbol that represents us all at home and abroad is the red and white National Flag of Canada. In 1982, Canadian mountaineer Laurie Skreslet brought the national flag with him to the highest point in the world, Mount Everest.

• In 1984, the Canadian flag reached new heights when it was launched into space on the flight along with the first Canadian astronaut on the NASA space shuttle Challenger.

• The role of flag-bearer for Canadian teams attending international sporting events is a special honour for those like Tessa Virtue and Scott Moir who proudly represented Canada at the PyeongChang Olympic and Paralympic Games in 2018.

• When the National Flag flies along with the flags of the 10 provinces and three territories, the flags of the provinces and territories follow in the order that they entered Confederation. For those years when multiple provinces entered Confederation, their flags are arranged by size of population at time of entry. The order of precedence is therefore as follows: Ontario (1867), Quebec (1867), Nova Scotia (1867), New Brunswick (1867), Manitoba (1870), British Columbia (1871), Prince Edward Island (1873), Saskatchewan (1905), Alberta (1905), Newfoundland and Labrador (1949), Northwest Territories (1870), Yukon (1898) and Nunavut (1999). www.canada.ca


Animal License

WECAN now in Rvlev! About WECAN Food Basket

The WECAN Food Basket Society operates as a "warehouse without walls" - we buy all our food in bulk and distribute it to our community based depots. Volunteers staff the depots located throughout the Edmonton and surrounding area. Once a month, volunteer drivers pick up the food from our supplier, The Grocery People Warehouse, and take it to the depots. Our volunteers then count, sort and pack the baskets ready for pick up.

WECAN Mission Statement

The WECAN Food Basket Society provides families and individuals with food security by giving them the opportunity to purchase nutritious food at an affordable price.

The Program in Tofield-Ryley

Members prepay for their food baskets by the first Friday of each month by depositing their order envelope: (Tofield) in the book depository at the Tofield Municipal Library, or (Ryley) in the mail slot at the Village of Ryley Office. Then, orders can be picked up on the third or fourth Thursday of the month (see table at right) at (Tofield) Bardo Lutheran Church, or (Ryley) Ryley Municipal Office.

A WECAN Food Basket consists of...

Fresh food is the staple of any healthy diet. Our food offering is:

Meat Order (\$15): 2-3 cuts of frozen meat,

Produce Order (\$10): 3 types of fresh vegetables and 3 kinds of seasonal fruit

Members can order whatever quantity of each order they would like, for example:

2 produce + 1 meat = \$35 or 2 meat + 1 produce = \$40Members prepay for their food basket on or by the first Friday of each month. Check Calendar for exceptions to orders and pick up dates.

Membership is \$5 per year: Apr 1 to Mar 31.

Please put your name, phone number and how many meat and produce orders you would like along with the cost on the front of the envelope. We encourage you to use your unused utility bill envelopes. RECYCLE!
