Haiti Rebuilding Fundraiser

Did you know ... Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. The unemployment rate is over 80% and the average Haitian lives on \$2 per day. Plagued by political unrest and catastrophic natural disasters throughout its history, the people need international humanitarian support.

Ryley resident, Margaret Jones, is planning to travel to Haiti with a team to assist with rebuilding homes and communities damaged or destroyed by the 2010 earthquake and/or the 2016 hurricane, two of the most devastating natural disasters in its history.

The trip is organized by Haiti ARISE (haitiarise.org). Haiti ARISE provides support to the Haitians through many programs and is funded through donations and fundraisers. Trip expenses are Margaret's responsibility; fundraising proceeds go directly to project costs, such as building materials and wages for Haitian workmen.

Daylight Savings Time!

Sunday, March 10, 2019, 2:00:00 a.m. clocks are turned forward 1 hour.

Sunrise and sunset will be about 1 hour later on March 10, 2019 than the day before. There will be more light in the evening.

Daylight saving time (DST) is observed in all ten Canadian provinces and three territories. However, there are exceptions within several provinces and the territory of Nunavut, including most of Saskatchewan, which observes Central Standard Time year-round even though the province is in the Mountain Zone, effectively putting it on DST year-round. Under the Canadian Constitution, laws related to timekeeping are a purely provincial or territorial matter.

In regions where daylight saving time is used, it commences on the second Sunday of March, and standard time restarts on the first Sunday in November. Daylight saving time lasts for a total of 34 weeks (238 days) every year, about 65% of the entire year.

WECAN now in Rvlev! **About WECAN Food Basket**

The WECAN Food Basket Society operates as a "warehouse without walls" - we buy all our food in bulk and distribute it to our community based depots. Volunteers staff the depots located throughout the Edmonton and surrounding area. Once a month, volunteer drivers pick up the food from our supplier, The Grocery People Warehouse, and take it to the depots. Our volunteers then count, sort and pack the baskets ready for pick up.

WECAN Mission Statement

The WECAN Food Basket Society provides families and individuals with food security by giving them the opportunity to purchase nutritious food at an affordable price.

The Program in Tofield-Ryley

Members prepay for their food baskets by the first Friday of each month by depositing their order envelope: (Tofield) in the book depository at the Tofield Municipal Library, or (Ryley) in the mail slot at the Village of Ryley Office. Then, orders can be picked up on the third or fourth Thursday of the month (see table at right) at (Tofield) Bardo Lutheran Church, or (Ryley) Ryley Municipal Office.

A WECAN Food Basket consists of...

Fresh food is the staple of any healthy diet. Our food offering is:

Meat Order (\$15): 2-3 cuts of frozen meat, Produce Order (\$10): 3 types of fresh vegetables and 3 kinds of seasonal fruit

Members can order whatever quantity of each order they would like, for example:

2 produce + 1 meat = \$35 or 2 meat + 1 produce = \$40Members prepay for their food basket on or by the first Friday of each month. Check Calendar for exceptions to orders and pick up dates.

Membership is \$5 per year: Apr 1 to Mar 31.

Please put your name, phone number and how many meat and produce orders you would like along with the cost on the front of the envelope. We encourage you to use your unused utility bill envelopes. RECYCLE!

Future health-care professionals are coming to Tofield in April - and the community is looking to make a great first impression! Medical and nursing students, and other future health-care professionals in-training, will be participating in an RhPAP Health-care Skills Weekend event on April 13-14, 2019 at Tofield Healthcare Centre.

RhPAP Skills events provide future health providers with the opportunity to experience what it's like to be a health-care provider in a rural Alberta community, and discover practice sites they may wish to consider in the future. Participants learn about health care in a rural environment, and receive instruction in basic health-care skills from local health providers. Communities also use this opportunity to showcase what they have to offer to future health-care professionals as potential future members of the community.

Cats: Free/Fixed, \$15/Not Fixed

We ask that if you have a picture of your pet, bring it in for us to photocopy. This helps us find the owner, if a pet's tag has been lost or removed. Please note that if you have your pet registered in a different town or city, you are still required to get a Ryley Animal License. Please remember that dogs and cats are to be kept contained within the owners property, or possession, at all times. Snow Removal Reminder

Residents and business owners are responsible for clearing all public sidewalks adjacent to their property (front and side) within 48 hours of a snowfall; and maintaining them free from ice and other debris. The fine for failing to clear sidewalks is the cost of clearing by the Village. Please note you can not pile or spread snow from private property or public sidewalks onto the street. The exception to this is on Main Street, from 50 Ave. to 52 Ave. where businesses do not have a vacant area or a boulevard. We ask that if you see your street being cleared of snow to please move your vehicle so public works can effectively clear the roads.
