



Hello Ryley! It's been six weeks since you've welcomed me as your new CAO. I've met many of you; of course, I forget some of your names even though I do recognize your face! Give me some time and we will get to know each other better. In any case, thank you for being so warm and chatty with me. I feel accepted and I hope I can serve you well.

I bet you want to know what I think after my first month... Well, my "biggest think" is that Ryley needs a permanent CAO to stick around for a little while! I'll do my best to make that happen. In the meantime, here are some of my "smaller thinks" ...



ITHINK... Council has had a tough time trying to settle in

and trying get things done. Just as they started to develop a rhythm, it's been CAO change over time AGAIN. Even a seasoned Council would struggle without a stable and permanent chief of staff. Therefore, my key priority is supporting Council so they can govern effectively. I will work extra hard so we can get decisions and see action. The provincial election has not helped either: for example, we cannot yet apply for a number of grants that we normally receive before summer. This introduced additional pressure and delays this year – "sticks in my spokes" as I like to say. But, I am tenacious and we will persevere!

ITHINK... You need better information about our municipal health and wealth. Although our Village business is available on our website for you to view, there is a lot of data and detail to shuffle through. And some of you don't even surf the Internet. Therefore, another priority of mine is developing better ways to keep you informed. On that note, if you haven't noticed yet, we have new permanent fire pits with cook tops at the Campground. As for roads, expect to see 52 Avenue rebuild work to start very soon from 52 Street to 57 Avenue. We are trying to get some additional roadwork done this year; but again, late grant timelines are at play and I just got here so we might need to settle with planning this fall to be aggressive and early for next year.

ITHINK... We are going to develop a great relationship. I have been spending my time getting to know as many people in the community as possible and working toward fostering good neighbour communications. The staff and I are very interested in hearing from you – please do not think of it as complaining if you bring us your concerns or issues. We cannot solve problems that we don't know about. Each complaint, concern, comment or issue is a puzzle piece of a bigger picture and sometimes a trend will emerge that helps us understand some hidden underlying problem. Besides, we exist for you and to inform Council for you. Of course, we're always happy to hear about positive things.

So that's just a bit of what "I think". Angel and Jocelyn asked me to remind you that Friday 16 August is your deadline if you need to appeal your property taxes and that Thursday 19 September is your final tax due date. My last word is that I'm still here, I'm having fun and I plan to stick around for a little while.

About WECAN Food Basket

The WECAN Food Basket Society operates as a "warehouse without walls" – we buy all our food in bulk and distribute it to our community based depots. Volunteers staff the depots located throughout the Edmonton and surrounding area. Once a month, volunteer drivers pick up the food from our supplier, The Grocery People Warehouse, and take it to the depots. Our volunteers then count, sort and pack the baskets ready for pick up.

The Program in Tofield-Ryley

Members prepay for their food baskets by the first Friday of each month by depositing their order envelope: (Tofield) in the book depository at the Tofield Municipal Library, or (Ryley) in the mail slot at the Village of Ryley Office. Then, orders can be picked up on the third or fourth Thursday of the month (see table below) at (Tofield) Bardo Lutheran Church, or (Ryley) Ryley Municipal Office.

A WECAN Food Basket consists of...

Fresh food is the staple of any healthy diet. Our food offering is:

Meat Order (\$15): 2-3 cuts of frozen meat, Produce Order (\$10): 3 types of fresh vegetables and 3 kinds of seasonal fruit

Members can order whatever quantity of each order they would like, for example:

2 produce + 1 meat = \$35 or 2 meat + 1 produce = \$40 Members prepay for their food basket on or by the first Friday of each month. Check Calendar for exceptions to orders and pick up dates.

Membership is \$5 per year: Apr 1 to Mar 31.

Please do not blow your grass clippings onto the street or alley. They decompose, become mud and can plug up the curbs and drainage system. Public works employees have been out hand shoveling the gutters to get them clean. Please do your part by NOT filling them with grass cuttings.

Recreational Vehicle Reminder

It's that time of year for holidays, camping and trips. Please keep in mind that Bylaw No. 2010-894 13.1 states "No person shall park any trailer, or permit any trailer to be parked upon any highway within the municipality unless the trailer is attached to a vehicle by which it may be propelled or drawn; when the trailer is attached, it shall be deemed to be part of the vehicle to which it is attached, and shall be subject to the regulation pertaining to vehicles unless otherwise authorized by the Administrator."

"Trailer" means a vehicle so designed that it may be attached to or drawn by a motor vehicle and intended to transport property or persons and includes any trailer that is designed, constructed and equipped as a dwelling place, living abode or sleeping place, either permanently or temporarily, but does not include machinery or equipment used in the construction or maintenance of highways.

Public smoking or vaping of cannabis

There have been a few questions and concerns about people freely using cannabis. For those who use please read below the list of prohibited areas.

As of October 17, 2018, Albertans 18 years of age and older are now allowed to smoke or vape cannabis in certain areas.

Citizens are responsible for following important federal and provincial rules applying to the legal and responsible use of cannabis.

In an effort to protect children and limit second-hand exposure, public smoking or vaping of cannabis in Alberta will be prohibited from any place where tobacco smoking is restricted, as well as additional areas. Here is a comprehensive list of prohibited areas for your reference:

- Public buildings/enclosed areas
- Building common areas
- Group living facilities
- Outdoor bus or taxi shelters
- Licensed premises and restaurants
- Workplaces
- Hotels
- Hospital/school/childcare facility property
- outdoor theatres, out door pools, splash parks and skating rinks, skateboard or bicycle parks, playgrounds, sports or playing fields, a doorway/widow/air intake of a public building, enclosed area or a workplace
- · From any motor vehicles, with the exception of those being used as a temporary residences, such as a parked RV

To report an illegal use of cannabis, contact your local RCMP.

Putting up a fence? Digging a new garden? Doing any outside reno's?

Alberta One Call provides a FREE communication service, between the digging community and the owners of buried facilities, to arrange for the marking of the location of buried facilities before a ground disturbance takes place.
