What's In the CAO's Siahts?

Hello Ryley! I have some great news. We are on the final leg for "Cessation of the Train Whistle!" All the necessary bureaucratic papers and reports and studies and certificates and measures and emails and letters and phone calls are complete. Just to make certain though, Angel is going to keep talking with CN and Transport Canada to ensure the file doesn't get put aside. Very soon we will no longer hear that train whistle coming through!

So, what else is in my sights? Well, as I am rustling around the daily details of our annual budget, our HR and administrative policies, and how we can become more efficient in managing our community services, my biggest concern is our Capital Plan. It's very simple to see if a municipality has a successful Capital Plan: what is the condition of the roads? Roads are a key indicator for a successful Capital Plan. I would say that we are not doing well. However, we are not alone. In fact, we are very average. Some people call it a national emergency because of the extremely high percentage of municipalities across Canada that are struggling with their infrastructure like roads. It's very easy to see the problem and very easy to criticize the management of infrastructure – however, it's very difficult to achieve success. If it were easy, there wouldn't be a national emergency. That said, we can do this!

If you ever wonder what the big hype has been about the recent changes to the Municipal Government Act (MGA), the primary focus is on infrastructure and ensuring that municipalities have the assistance they need to adopt a good Capital Plan. The toughest part about a Capital Plan is wrapping our minds around creating a very long-term and a stable commitment that covers decades of activities, and then sticking to that plan year after year. Roads are only one part of many in a Capital Plan but let me characterize the issue...

Ryley has approximately 10 kilometres of streets. A typical asphalt has a life of 20 years if maintained properly and can last 30 years if well-maintained. If we were to pave all roads in Ryley next year, we would need to redo everything again in 20 years, a huge problem now and then again in 20 years. This is where we are right now, and we need to get out of this problem. Besides, we cannot pave 10 kms next year - we don't have that kind of money saved up: somewhere between 10 and 20 million dollars depending on sidewalk, drainage, sewer and water repairs needed. In order to budget for this, we must look at spreading this over the life of a road: 20 years. Therefore, we need to pave one kilometer every 2 years. It's going to take 20 years to get Ryley

paved. The problem is that we can't speed this up because it would cost too much in loan and interest fees. a debt which means we wouldn't be saving for the next cycle. Additionally, we would be struggling for cash to maintain those roads properly, which would mean our roads would decline faster than 20 years.

We have a great challenge today and we want to avoid this challenge for our future generations and to set them up for the next cycle to use our well-managed savings to make things even better next time. If we do things correctly now and maintain things well as we rebuild in the coming years, our infrastructure can last much longer. This would be a huge savings for additional future initiatives. We need to think of this just like mortgaging our first home. We will need to borrow something, or we would never get started. The trick is that we need to balance our debt load with our cashflow to find the best balance of enjoying today and paying for tomorrow. The good news is that the federal and provincial governments are focused on rewarding those of us that get good Capital Plans in place so I'm enthusiastic.

As the CAO, it's my job to deliver these ideas to Council and to offer up a few good options that they can consider and weigh against our collective community priorities. So, while Council and I are developing next year's budget, my biggest consideration is how we are going to mortgage our Capital Plan.

WECAN now in Ryley! About WECAN Food Basket

The WECAN Food Basket Society operates as a "warehouse without walls" – we buy all our food in bulk and distribute it to our community based depots. Volunteers staff the depots located throughout the Edmonton and surrounding area. Once a month, volunteer drivers pick up the food from our supplier, The Grocery People Warehouse, and take it to the depots. Our volunteers then count, sort and pack the baskets ready for pick up.

The Program in Tofield-Ryley

Members prepay for their food baskets by the first Friday of each month by depositing their order envelope: (Tofield) in the book depository at the Tofield Municipal Library, or (Ryley) in the mail slot at the Village of Ryley Office. Then, orders can be picked up on the third or fourth Thursday of the month (see table below) at (Tofield) Bardo Lutheran Church, or (Ryley) Ryley Municipal Office.

A WECAN Food Basket consists of...

Fresh food is the staple of any healthy diet. Our food offering is:

Meat Order (\$15): 2-3 cuts of frozen meat,

Produce Order (\$10): 3 types of fresh vegetables and 3 kinds of seasonal fruit

Members can order whatever quantity of each order they would like, for example:

2 produce + 1 meat = \$35 or 2 meat + 1 produce = \$40Members prepay for their food basket on or by the first Friday of each month. Check Calendar for exceptions to orders and pick up dates.

Membership is \$5 per year: Apr 1 to Mar 31.
