New Business in Ryley Welcome Gradient Imaging!

Mike Klassen started Gradient Imaging in the spring of 2019. He saw a need for local aerial imaging and thermography. Mike has lived in Ryley with his wife and three kids for almost 20 years. He helped start the Sports Day Music Festival and has helped with several other events around the county. He has been a photographer for Farmer Days in Holden, Sports Days in Ryley and was the official photographer for "Our Big Little Walk" for three years. Mike is a journeyman electrician, Level II Thermographer and Level I Optical Gas Imaging Technician. Below is some of what Mike can do. NDVI- For more than 40 years agronomists and scientists have used Normalized Difference Vegetation Index (NDVI) to assess the health of crops and plants. NDVI was created when scientists learned that a plant's unique reflection of a combination of visible red light and near-infrared (NIR) light gave a good indication of plant health. NDVI data provides growers with an accurate measurement of crop vigour and allows them to zero in on problem areas that may need further attention.

In the last 40 years, advances in technology have allowed for integration of high-quality NDVI images onto manned aircraft. Even the smallest consumer-grade drones with accurate NDVI sensors can rival any expensive remote-sensing platform. Geo-tagging will allow you zero in on the problem areas.

Crop Scouting/ Insurance Claims- Crop scouting is done with an RGB (visible light) camera that allows you to see your fields without entering them and damaging your crops. We are able to fly your fields quicker than walking them saving you valuable time and Geo-tagging will allow you to go directly to problem areas. With the digital maps we are able to provide, you will also be able to measure areas to get accurate size of damage, for you or your insurance adjuster. With our ability to fly at up to 120m (400 feet) you will also get a view that you have likely never seen before.

Aerial Photography/Videography- Fly over view gives you a unique look at your event, property or anything you want a picture of from the air. Using drone photography for events gives your audience a spectacular view of the action and scale of your event. We are able to produce shots not possible with terrestrial based cameras. We typically fly a 20 mega-pixel camera and are able to fly within a few feet of an object or fly

at 120m (400 feet) giving you a unique view of your event. You will be able to post the video or pictures on your social media or website allowing you the opportunity to share the memories of the event, spread your message or reach a new audience.

Thermal Imaging- Aerial Thermal Imaging shows where there is heat loss in your building envelope. This can allow you to know where there is a problem area in your building, affording you the opportunity to repair the damage and save money.

With one of the few RPAS equipped with a Thermal Imaging camera and a Level II thermographer at the controls in our arsenal we can see where there is heat loss, water intrusion, thermal bridging or insulation damage.

With our hand held thermal camera we are able to perform fault diagnosis and troubleshooting. We can locate moisture in walls and roofs, we can also see thermal leaks from windows, doors and building envelopes. We are also able to troubleshoot electrical and heating issues through out your home or business.

Real Estate: Residential- Get sweeping aerial views of the property, home features and property highlights. You can add videos to YouTube or your own site and reach more potential buyers from around the world. Real estate aerial photography and videography is great for agents and brokers who want to add that "wow" factor to their listing. We will also be able to highlight local amenities such as proximity to schools or maybe just the view from the back deck. This footage will allow you to give a virtual showing in any weather.

SAR- Search and Rescue is a time sensitive operation and time is not on your side. With an RPAS equipped with a thermal camera we can help with the operations. We are able to deploy quicker than a conventional airplane. While airplanes are able to fly longer we are able to fly slower and lower, this allows us to pinpoint the location. We can also do an autonomous grid search allowing precision and less wasted time covering the same area over.

Large Item PickUp Thursday, October 24

This annual Program is provided at no-charge to municipal residents. Residents will need to place their large items directly on the front street by the curb, the evening before their scheduled pick up. They are asked not to place items on the grass or lawn, but rather directly on the street as it is easier for Beaver Municipal Solutions staff to clean up any broken materials. Please ensure to place all items at least 3 feet (1 meter) from parked vehicles.

For Beaver County rural residents, large items can be taken to the transfer stations as per the following schedule:

Saturday, October 5 - Tofield Transfer Station

Friday, October 18 - Kinsella Transfer Station

*Please note that Lindbrook and Viking Transfer Stations now accept large items year round.

Fridges, freezers and water coolers are acceptable, however there is a \$25 charge for Freon removal. Urban residents can pay for the Freon removal sticker at either the local Town/Village office or at the Beaver Municipal Solutions Administration office located at the landfill. Lindbrook and Viking Transfer Stations accept Freon-containing appliances year round for the same \$25 charge.

Acceptable Items: Mattresses, Sofas, Recliners, White goods (stove, washing machine, etc.) and appliances, Tires and Propane tanks.

Unacceptable Items to set out for Large Item Pick Up: Grass clippings, trees, tree branches, Large chunks of cement/concrete, Bags of household garbage, Small items that would fit in the neighbourhood waste bin and Electronic waste. These unacceptable items, except chunks of concrete, can be taken to the Ryley landfill or any Transfer Station anytime. Please note: cement and concrete will only be accepted at the Ryley landfill site.

BEAVER REGIONAL ARTS SOCIETY PROUDLY ANNOUNCES IT'S 40th SEASON HISTORY: The Paragon Theatre was built in 1952 and operated as a movie theatre until 1964 or 1965. The building was closed from 1965 until 1978. In the 1970's Beaver County Recreation and Parks Administrator George Baker had a dream of a regional arts centre for the people. With the help of numerous civic-minded individuals and Beaver Country's purchase of the Paragon Movie Theatre in Holden for the princely sum of \$1.00 the dream took on a life of its own.

The Beaver Regional Arts Society was formed in 1976. From 2016 until the present, the facility is being operated by Beaverhill Players who changed the name back to the Paragon Theatre.
