Temporary Extension of Expiring Motor Vehicle Documents

The Registrar of Motor Vehicle Services has enacted section 75.1 of the Operator Licensing and Vehicle Control Regulation, Alta Regulation 320/2002.

This is to assist the residents of Alberta who may encounter difficulties renewing their drivers' licence, vehicle registration, or any motor vehicle document prescribed by the Regulation.

Essentially, Albertans with expiring driver's licences and/or vehicle registrations have until May 15, 2020 to renew these documents. Specifically:

- Motor vehicle documents that expire March 17, 2020 through to May 14, 2020 are hereby extended, and remain subsisting and valid until midnight on May 15, 2020.

- Motor vehicle documents include driver's licence, identification card and vehicle motor vehicle document prescribed by the Regulation.

CAO's Corner: Council Forges Forward

Hello Ryley! Firstly, I'd like to apologize for the Village Voice being a week late this month. We wanted to focus on getting last week's letter from Mayor and the "Community Together" paperwork out to you. Please sign up for Community Together so we can show the strength of Ryley looking after Ryley. Lucky for you, as this edition is a week late, we can provide some highlights from the Regular Council Meeting of Tuesday 7 April. Council assembles via video conference during this COVID-19 crisis to keep moving business forward, so I encourage you to join in on future meetings; I am betting that you have the time and are looking for new and safe things to do and you could alternatively join by telephone, so it is very easy and simple.

First on Council agenda was a Public Hearing to move forward our Municipal Development Plan (MDP). The MDP is a statutory document, meaning that the Government of Alberta requires every municipality to have one by Bylaw. Our present MDP Bylaw is from the 90's so it is time for a new one. The new draft MDP Bylaw is a high-level document that is conceptual; however, its key value is to paint a picture of what future Ryley should look like by using principles and policies to guide me and the staff when we make day-to-day development decisions. The Public Hearing provided you (our residents) an opportunity to inform Council if you have any concerns about the MDP. Now that the Public Hearing is complete, Council also carried out Second Reading of the MDP Bylaw. However, Council felt that final adoption of the MDP could wait a month because of everything going on around us with the pandemic. Council delayed Third and Final Reading to provide the public an extra opportunity to review and comment.

One huge impact of this pandemic is the loss of income for many of you. Council is looking for ways to ease your financial burden by considering two main tactics: deferral and forgiveness. Deferral eases your payment now but does not ease the fact that you must pay that bill later. It is a form of a free loan. Forgiveness is a gift of paying your bill. Forgiveness is not free. While it helps you, money needs to come from somewhere and Council will need to weigh the risk to municipal services and projects when it considers forgiveness. The Provincial Government is offering many initiatives to help, and these are almost exclusively deferral types of help. Council resolved at this last meeting to waive overdue fees on Utility Bills until 1 December 2020. This six-month deferral means that any outstanding utility balance due on 1 June 2020 will not be charged the 5% penalty. In other words, your Ryley Utility bill is no longer due on 31 May and is now

due on 30 November. Council sees this as an extremely important discussion and will keep it on the agenda as the pandemic continues.

Regardless of the pandemic and the challenge of meeting via video conference, Council achieved a significant amount of important decisions. One final item of utmost importance to all of us is the decision made by the Battle River School Division to combine the Holden and Ryley Schools into a K-9 and to remove our Grades 10 to 12. Council considers this decision as completely unacceptable. Therefore, Ryley is immediately requesting that the Minister of Education intervene and impose a one-year moratorium to delay this decision until September 2021. In the meantime, Council resolved that we investigate options to deliver Grades 10-12 locally. This will involve significant consideration, study and coordination. However, before embarking on such a daunting task, we need to ask if this is something you want. Especially if you are a parent of our Grades 9-11; What options would you support? Do you want Ryley to engage on this?

Council directed me to develop a network of stakeholders to collect this information. I will be communicating very soon on this. As a first start, please go to our new forum and tell us what you think about this: <http://www.ryley.ca/forums/forum/ryley-school-project/>

from the UR – Urban Reserve District to the C2 – Commercial (2) District, as shown on Schedule A.

The Council for the Village of Ryley held a public hearing and made second reading on April 7, 2020. Third reading will take place at the next Regular Council Meeting on April 21, 2020.
