




2020 Spring Large Item Pick-Up **Program SUSPENDED**

Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, our annual spring Large Item Pick-Up Program is suspended in order to protect our waste collection staff. Residents who have large items that need to be disposed of this spring have some options. They can:

1. Take their items to either the Ryley Landfill, the Lindbrook Transfer Station or the Viking Transfer Station, as large items are accepted year-round at these locations. o Staff at these locations will not be helping residents unload their items.

o Residents dropping items off at any of our locations must maintain the 6 feet social distancing protocol. o The \$25 Freon disposal charge remains in effect, however we have temporarily suspended cash payments at our sites. Payment must be made by credit or debit.

2. Hold their items until the program is resumed after the pandemic is over. Currently our next pick-up program is tentatively scheduled for October, pending the status of COVID-19.

Ouestions can be directed to our office at 780.663.2038. Callers must leave a message along with their name and number as administration staff are currently working remotely. Calls will be retrieved by the following business day and returned.

River Rock Cafe' Update

We're OPEN with shortened hours, and a take out menu only. We must follow all the rules set in place by Alberta Health Services! Big fines if we do not abide by the rules. We all want to stay safe and healthy. 1. Hand washing is a must!

2. Social distancing is a must!

3. Pick up for take out will be located at the north side door of restaurant, up the ramp. We have debit available with tap. We will have hand sanitizer for you to clean hands before and after using machine. 4. We have extensively sanitized the restaurant and all equipment. We will continue to do so all day long.

Just a reminder that all of our burgers are made in restaurant and contain no fillers (bread crumbs) so they are gluten free. We roast our own beef and turkeys here too. Our vegetables are purchased mostly locally when in season, very little processed foods enter our kitchen, we use real cheddar cheese, no MSG, and we do not have a deep fryer.

We now have homemade potato, and macaroni salads available. We are also willing to do lunch's up ahead for farmers, or any workers. Sandwiches, burgers, or bigger meals for a bunch of people. Will need to call ahead.

Trees and Grass

Trimming Trees and bushes: Residents are responsible to trim their trees and bushes to be within the bounds of their own property. This applies to back alleys, trees and bushes hanging over the sidewalk, and hanging over your neighbour's property. Help the Village walkways stay clear for everyone to use, prune your trees and bushes. Please be courteous to your neighbours to ensure that your trees and shrubbery do not encroach on their property.

Grass Clippings: Many of our streets cannot be cleaned by the street sweeper. Please do not blow your grass clippings onto the street or alley. They decompose, become mud and can plug up the curbs and drainage system. Public works employees have been out hand shoveling the gutters to get them clean. Please do your part by keeping them clear of grass and leaves.

Mental Health Help Line

Information provided by Tofield/Ryley/Beaver County FCSS Alberta Health Services (AHS) has boosted its service to help Albertans should they need to speak with someone about mental health concerns.

If Albertans call the Mental Health Help Line at 1-877-303-2642 or the Addiction Help Line at 1-866-332-2323 between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m., seven days a week, they will be connected directly to a dedicated team of AHS addiction and mental health staff.

This change will support 811 operators to focus on COVID-19 calls during the day and improve wait times for others needing telephone advice. Calls placed from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. will continue to be routed through 811.

Current Fire Ban Status FIRE ADVISORY

Please be advised:

Burning anything outside of fire pits and burn barrels with a regulation screen is prohibited without a valid fire permit.

All outdoor burning requires a burning permit within Beaver County. Permits can be obtained from, the towns of Tofield, Viking, the villages of Holden, Ryley, Beaver County office, and the Beaver Emergency Services Commission Office, County Councillors and all local Fire Chiefs.
