Over this past year we have seen many challenges and many changes to the way the municipal landscape is shaping up. Whilst managing these, CAO Hambro has been helping create new initiatives like the Ryley School Project, the Solar Panel Project, and the new Ryley Community Together program while managing the ever changing demands of COVID-19 over the last 4+ months.

We would like to take this time to thank CAO Hambro for his dedication and determination to help Council continue to serve our residents in the best manner possible. CAO's Corner:

Hello Ryley – Welcome to Summer! It is finally starting to feel like summer as we are enjoying some hotter days now. I encourage you to get out and enjoy it while keeping "COVID Safe". As we are all seeing in the news, COVID cases are starting to rise again, especially in some states in the USA as they opened too aggressively in May. We need to remain vigilant. It has been a long challenge on our mental and physical health. It is proving to be a marathon as advertised; success is all about permanently changing how we act and move about in public. We must be aware of how the bug spreads if we are to prevent the spread and we must battle false rumours, dangerous anecdotes and conspiracy theories with hard science, true statistical data and facts. The most important data is that the virus spreads through your mouth and nose into your lungs. Therefore firstly, keeping distance from others will ensure you cannot spread it or catch it. Unless secondly, you leave it or pick it up from some transfer point – something that you touch. That is all. That is key. That is the secret! Every other rule is based on this. Keeping our hands clean and away from our face is simply battling the transportation system used by the virus

Based on the protocols we must implement if we open the office, we are keeping the office locked for a while longer. I feel that we would only be inviting you to increase your chances of spreading the virus if we were to open our door. Of course, if we were a business that relied on walk-in traffic, it would be worth the risk and the measures that the provincial health officer orders require. However, I feel quite strongly that we are serving you well and that we can continue to serve you in every way you need while our door remains closed. We are logging every phone call and monitoring every issue. We are returning your call if you leave a message and we are arranging appointments, if necessary. The provincial health protocols that we would need to implement if we were to open the door would reduce our efficiency too much because we would need to spend too much extra time doing those additional health protocol tasks such as greeting people outside, briefing people on our measures, conducting a safety guestionnaire and briefing, controlling the movement of people inside the building, and wiping and cleaning surfaces after each person. We simply do not have enough staff to do all these tasks required without reducing our efficiency. Finally, I feel that by going through all of this, we would be encouraging you to come down and spread the virus. I cannot see the wisdom in opening the door vet.

I must apologize that we have not kept you up to date on the RV Dumping Station. In the fall we closed it a little early because it became plugged, and we could not get it cleared. This spring we still could not get it cleared and we sent a camera down there to discover that the blockage had caused the underground pipes to separate. It will be a large cost to dig up the ground and reattach this sewage pipe. Interestingly, with it closed, we discovered through enquiries that many people from miles around, including people from Édmonton, use our RV Dumping Station because it is free dumping and free water: you as tax payers have been paying for this through municipal costs - the gallons of water that Ryley has been giving out freely has been expensive. We will be constructing a shower and toilet building at the camparound soon and we plan to move the RV Dumping Station to be tied in with this new building. Therefore, it does not make sense to spend too much on the present location. Either way, when we re-open our RV Dumping Station, we will be adding some water metering controls to make outsiders pay for our water.

We received numerous queries about this year's tax bills: Where are they? When will they be sent out? Council approved the Annual Budget on June 29. Therefore, we are now assembling the Tax Bills and expect to have them in the mail very soon. I will remind everyone that Council made a resolution to waive the first late fees in 2020: given the financial hardship that the pandemic has caused, your only due date in 2020 is 30 November with unpaid bills being penalized only once this year on 1 December.
