CAO's Corner

Hello Ryley!

What is with that water bill! This feels like highway robbery... Highway 14 Robbery!

I jestí I know it húrts, but this raise in "urban monthly fixed charge" from \$28.50 to \$40.80 is a necessary evil. I personally know that Highway 14 Regional Water Services Commission did not take lightly, the decision to raise your rates.

Ryley's water "distribution" system is the underground pipes that convey drinking water to your home from the "transmission" line that runs down Highway 14 from Edmonton, through Strathcona County. In 1992, almost 30 years ago, the newly formed Highway 14 Regional Water Services Commission (Hwy 14) bought the Ryley water distribution system.

The Hwy 14 water distribution system in Ryley is made of asbestos-cement pipes (AC), which was also called "transite". Transite was an immensely popular product in the fifties and sixties when our system was installed, and AC pipe life-expectancy was around fifty to seventy years. As these ones were installed in the fifties, this means that they should have been fully replaced by today... if a strict maintenance plan had been followed.

The recommended way to manage costs for civic infrastructure is through "amortization": the cost of the system divided by life-expectancy should be set aside each year and that money is called the "accumulated amortization". That is a piggy bank to pay for replacements, which should be scheduled in such a way to keep pace with the accumulated amortization and be completed over several years so that money is not wasted on excessive emergency repairs on a system that got too old.

Unfortunately, the Hwy 14 water distribution system in Ryley is mainly untouched, is now well past its life-expectancy and is costing too much for maintenance. Hwy 14 took advantage of our 54 Avenue rebuild in 2020 to conduct the first watermain replacement to this old system. Those three blocks of watermain and residential service replacements cost around \$400K. At that rate, given approximately thirty blocks of watermain, it is going to cost approximately \$4M to replacement the Ryley water distribution system. These are VERY rough numbers. Actual estimates and design plans should come out to less. However, it is also going to cost Hwy 14 significant money for maintenance breaks and repairs until replacement is complete. So, the question is: where will Hwy 14 get the money to rebuild the Ryley water distribution system?

The water comes from Edmonton. Hwy 14 buys it from EPCOR and sells it to you. This is the commodity rate that you pay. Given that there are many different types of customers on the system, Hwy 14 cannot simply raise the commodity rate to collect more money from everyone else to pay for the Ryley system.

Therefore, like all utility companies, Hwy 14 differentiates commodity from the delivery system and has developed numerous, tailored accumulated amortization accounts for the numerous different distribution systems. Hwy 14 collects "fixed fees" in relation to each specific distribution account. In fact, your fixed fee is a sum of two fees – one fee for the Ryley water distribu-

tion system and one fee for the transmission system. Council for the Village of Ryley is very much aware and is very much concerned about this raise in fixed fees. Although it is a necessary evil, I am investigating whether there are some ways we can ease this financial pressure. We are working very closely with Hwy 14 to ensure all repairs and maintenance can occur as cost efficiently as possible. Last summer's project on 54 Avenue is one example when we had the ground open for sewer upgrades: by coordinating with Hwy 14, we were able to get them into our open trenches at the same time to rebuild the water mains and to take advantage of our contractor's bulk pricing for supplies. Additionally, the Village of Ryley paid for one-third of the watermain upgrades from our capital budget. These two things brought significant savings for Hwy 14. Looking into the future, I am wondering if we might be able to work with Hwy 14 to assemble a comprehensive replacement plan so we can get a better cost estimate and then perhaps Ryley could commit a budget to a portion of that plan. This would lower the cost to Hwy 14 so they could lower their annual amortization and thus lower your fixed rate. This is just an idea and we are looking at others – one way or another, there is a cost and money must come from somewhere.

Even if the Village of Ryley pays Hwy 14 for some costs of the rebuild of the Ryley distribution system, the money will come from a budget that is generally based on taxes or fees on the backs of residents. On the other hand, it is possible that the Village might be able to access some infrastructure grant money that Highway 14 Regional Water Services Commissions cannot.

I know this fee hike is painful. Council has taken notice. We will work together and strive to "Live the Life of Ryley"

Family and Community Support Services Ryley (Ryley FCSS)

Ryley has embarked on the journey to develop its own FCSS program. A program designed especially for our unique community. So, what exactly is FCSS and what does that mean for us?

Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) is a unique 80/20 funding partnership between the Government of Alberta and participating municipalities or Métis Settlements. Provincially, the FCSS Program receives its mandate from the Family and Community Support Services Act and Regulation. The FCSS phi-

losophy is based on a belief that when individuals, families and communities help themselves, it contributes to a sense of integrity, self-worth, and independence. Local municipalities design, deliver and provide referral to social programs that are preventive in nature to promote and enhance well-being among the residents in their community.

Programs developed are intended to help improve the quality of life and build strength and capacity to prevent and/or deal with difficult situations should they arise. One of the key principles of the FCSS Program is local responsibility for priority setting and resource allocation with a focus on preventative services.

The municipality of Ryley is developing a local FCSS program to address the unique needs of its residents and those in the surrounding area. The program will support the well-being and resiliency of the community providing information, education and programs that provide preventative services. By coordinating, networking, and partnering with local service agencies, businesses, community members, together with regional FCSS organizations and partners, Ryley FCSS will endeavour to help strengthen our community while providing tools and resources to address social needs. Looking ahead, some of the areas of focus will be:

1. Preventative social programs, where people gain new skills and knowledge that will create a community that is resilient to crisis.

2. Resilient communities work together to prevent social problems and provide opportunities for children, youth, families, adults and seniors to fully participate in the community.

3. Strong partnerships that will bring people and agencies together, working in collaboration, to meet the needs of our communities.

4. Volunteers make social programs and resilient communities possible by giving their time and expertise to others while developing strong relationships and learning new skills.

Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) provides programming that is mandated to deliver social programs that "... are preventive in nature and are provided at the earliest opportunity in order to promote and enhance well-being among individuals, families, and communities." These programs depend on community resources and often involve volunteers working closely with staff members to support the delivery of programs. They work in partnership with other service providers in the local community and the surrounding region to try to prevent the need for intervention and rehabilitation services, by offering social supports that help to strengthen Albertans in their everyday lives. FCSS also provides links to other organizations that might provide further prevention-based opportunities to the public.
