Notice is hereby given that an election will be held for the filling of the following offices:

Election Day: Voting will take place on the 18th day of October, 2021, between the hours of 10:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. Mountain time. Voting stations will be located at: Ryley Community Centre, 5103 - 49 St. Ryley, AB

Eligibility to Vote: To be eligible to vote, you must meet the following requirements:

- 1. You must be at least 18 years old,
- 2. a Canadian citizen, and
- 3. Reside in Alberta and the person's place of residence is located in the local jurisdiction on election day. If you have any questions regarding your residency, contact the Returning Officer, Jessica Whamond, at 780-663-3653.

Voter Identification: When you attend the voting station to vote on Election Day or at the Advance Poll, you must produce valid identification to prove your identity and <u>place of residence</u>. The following documents will be considered valid identification:

- a) Photo ID issued by the Federal, Provincial, or local government, that contains your name and current address. Examples of this are a driver's license or other government issued Photo ID. **PO Box numbers will NOT be accepted; and**
- b) ID that is accepted by the Province's Chief Electoral Officer. Examples of this are a utility bill, vehicle registration, pension plan or other government benefits statement, bank or credit card statement, or property tax assessment notice. For a complete list of valid ID documents, check the Ryley website at www.ryley.ca, or contact the Returning Officer, Jessica Whamond at 780-663-3653.

Only one proof of photo identity is required, but the photo identification must show <u>BOTH</u> the name and address of <u>each</u> voter. If your photo identification shows only your name, you must provide other valid identification that shows your current address.

If you do not produce valid identification, you will not be allowed to vote, even if the election officials at the voting station know you personally.

CAO's Corner:

the 2021 Municipal Election

Hello Ryley, in just over two weeks, on Monday, August 18, all municipalities across Alberta will voting to elect their Local Government Council. Your opportunity to exercise your privilege to elect your Village of Ryley Council representation is your main opportunity to impact your community. If you are a Beaver County resident in the Ryley area, you may vote in the County election for the Division 3 Councilor of the Beaver County Council. Landowners do not get to vote in a municipality unless they are a resident of that municipality.

You will have your opportunity to vote on a few additional things during this civic election:

- 1. <u>School Trustee:</u> vote for your representative from the Beaver County Area (Ward 2) of the Battle River School Division (BRSD) Board of Trustees.
- Senate Reform: Further still, you will have the privilege to vote for Alberta's representation on the Canadian Senate. Although, Senators are appointed by the Governor General on the Prime Minister's recommendations, Alberta has chosen to elect potential senators for the Prime Minister's consideration when one of the Western Senate seats become vacant.
- 3. <u>Referendum:</u> And finally, you may vote on two referendum questions: Should we keep changing our clocks for Daylight Savings? And, Should Canada continue to provide equalization payments to Provinces?

There are two main types of municipalities in Alberta:

- "RURAL", such a Beaver County or other Municipal Districts; and
- "URBAN", such as Cities, Towns and Villages. Ryley is an urban municipality.

Some urban municipalities, like Edmonton and Calgary, have a ward system. In a ward system, each ward has one or more seats and councilors for that ward are elected to council for that ward by the residents of that ward. As well, in a ward system, there is a separate ballot for the mayor. The mayor is the chair of council and is the Chief Elected Official.

The Village of Ryley does not have a ward system so all residents of Ryley vote for all five (5) seats of the Village of Ryley Council. You will have up to five (5) ballots to cast – you may cast one, two, three, four, or five ballots to select up to any of the five (5) candidates that you prefer out of the nine (9) candidates that are running for Ryley Council in this election.

Some residents have asked us how our mayor becomes our Chief Elected Official? In Ryley, because we do not have wards, we do not elect our mayor separately from our other councilors. We have five (5) seats for council, and all five (5) councilors are elected "at large" by you, the residents of Ryley. The very first important resolution that our new Ryley Council will make is the appointment of our Chief Elected Official - the Mayor. The first meeting of Council is a special meeting called an "Organizational Meeting". The CAO will call that meeting to order and call for nominations from the five councilors. Council will then vote and may do so as an open or secret vote and the Councilor with the most votes from Council will become the mayor for the next year. Each year in October, Council must hold a new Organizational Meeting to vote and appoint the mayor. So, we might have a different mayor for each of the next four (4) years of this Council's tenure until the next municipal election in 2025.

The Organizational Meeting is an important meeting because the mayor will then take the chair from the CAO and will then call for nominations for Deputy Mayor and for all the appointments to the Council Committees, Boards and Commissions for which our individual councilors will become members for the next year.

After the election, once we know who you voted in your new Ryley Council, your future opportunity to be heard will be one of four ways:

- Contact any (or all) of your Councilors and tell
 them your thoughts or ideas so they may take your
 advice into consideration for meetings. You can
 do this by talking to them on the street, phoning
 them, or asking to meet with them. While we (Administration) will create an official email for each
 Councilor that you may communicate through
 once they are elected, we also have a group email
 that goes to all council members: council@ryley.ca
- You can contact Administration. There are many ways to do this. Email to CAO@ryley.ca or info@ryley.ca is the easiest and most simple method. You may also call the office at 780.662.3653 and please leave a message if you get the answering service. We do check messages often. You may also write a letter to Council or Administration if you wish or drop a note through the office door mail slot.
- You may request to be a delegate at a Council Meeting. You will be given a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes to address Council directly in person (through video conference or connected via telephone during COVID virtual meetings). You may forward any documentation (like a letter or email) to Administration before your appearance

as a delegate and it will be sent to all councilors so they will be able to read it beforehand as part of the agenda package. Requests for appearance as a delegate should be submitted by Thursday before any meeting so you can be added to the agenda for the meeting. We try to include any delegation request up to the last hours before a meeting, but there is no guarantee that we can schedule you in if you miss the agenda deadline. Council meetings are business meetings so you may observe meetings, but you are not permitted to be involved in Council Meetings except as a delegate.

Apply to be a member of a Council Committee.
 Committees are official boards of representatives
 that meet regularly and make recommendations
 to Council on certain issues. Committees and
 boards gather input from the community and
 research issues. As a resident, you may apply and
 be appointed to a committee by Council. Ryley is
 developing some additional new committees such
 as Business and Economic Development Committee
 and a General Central Committee normally
 known as a Public Advisory Committee (PAC). At
 present, we already have a number of boards and
 committees such as our: Library Board; Clean Harbors Community Liaison Committee; and Family
 and Community Service Support (FCSS).

This upcoming civic election on Monday, October 18 is important so please vote. Please watch for announcements by our Returning Officer (RO), Jessica Whamond on information about the election. We also encourage you to attend and participate in any candidate forums that might occur. The Village wants to ensure that forum(s) occur so you may receive as much information about our candidates as possible. In these times of COVID restrictions where we cannot meet in large public indoor meetings, the Village will offer support to any organization or person that are planning forums because we have become technically capable at managing virtual meetings and we have resources for live-streaming.




