Ryley Truck Fill Upgrade is now complete and open. A ceremony was held on August 19th, 2021, to make it official. Thanks to the sponsorship of Beaver County/Bathgate Co-op, Claystone Waste and Highway 14 Water Services Commission.

There are now 2 Bulk loading bays: one for larger commercial vehicles and one for smaller haulers. Dispensing times are now faster and both bays can operate at the same time. There is a heated concrete pad to reduce ice issues.

Water dispensing accounts must be set up through the Highway 14 Regional Water Office during regular office hours. The Bulk Water Truck Fill rates are \$5.99/ m3. The Truck Fill is open 24/7 for your convenience.

CAO's Corner:

CHARTER SCHOOL?

Hello Ryley: Once again, I am writing in response to conversations I have had with some of our residents.

These discussions were about the Holden Rural Academy (HRA) - a Charter School Initiative. The questions posed to me: "Why should we residents of Ryley care about the HRA?"; "Won't the HRA be in competition with

and endanger our Ryley K-9 school?", and "What is the deal about these Parent Declarations?" For many years, the two Villages of Holden and Ryley offered a full K-12 public school option with K-6 in

Holden and 7-12 in Ryley. Our "Central Beaver Community" was served very well with this opportunity. But public-school funding pressures and a zeal to do more with less, prompted the School Division to close our argrades 10-12 and consolidate the K-9 in Ryley. Some look at this as Holden losing K-6. However, I submit that we in the Central Beaver Community should not be looking at it this way and we should be keeping our eyes on a "reasonable school zone" for Central Beaver County. In this way, Holden did not lose a K-6 school, it lost grades 10-12...we all have! Ryley may now house

the K-6 that were housed in Holden, but in all honesty,

K-9 is within a reasonable school zone, completely

reachable for our two Villages and our surrounding

focus should be on our loss of 10-12, Senior Secondary. The first real effect of losing 10-12 is that our youth, cerned, and we need a Senior Secondary solution back Worse yet, with the loss of grades 10-12, our students in grades 7-9 will need to think about their 10-12

community within Beaver County, whereas 10-12 is no longer. The K-9 Ryley school is just as much Ryley's as it is Holden's and Central Beaver County's. Our main indeed, our full community, is being "baptized" into thinking that the real world does not exist in Central Beaver. At a very early age after Grade 9, we are being told that we need to leave our community to get our grades, to succeed in life. We should be very coninto the Central Beaver "reasonable school zone" as soon as possible. choices in Tofield or Viking and which great distance they choose to travel, or they might decide to go with some other much more dynamic choice like moving to Edmonton and living with friends or relatives. Once that 10-12 choice has been made, it isn't long before a move some time in grade 7 to 9 makes sense as well: "to a school or option that is most aligned with the 10-12 choice I have made". Further: "if I am entering grade 7 and my big sister is moving to grade 10, I may as well commute with her and move now as well". It won't be long

before our grade 7-9 student population will decline, and the School Division will be forced to close these under-subscribed grades as well. Without a full K-12 solution in Central Beaver, our communities, our Villages will be less attractive and eventually the decline will cause the closure of our complete public-school opportunity. A Charter School is as much public school as the di-

vision. A Charter School reports directly to the Ministry of Education and must meet all the provincial curriculum requirements. The first difference is that a Charter School belongs to the community and the teachers and staff chosen would be ours to decide to hire, keep, or fire. Teachers must be certified provincially, but the division or the union or anybody else do not get to dictate our staff. We are free to invest in teachers that we decide are best suited for our school. The second difference is that a Charter School must adopt a unique methodology and ours (the HRA) has adopted "Place Based Education". Placed Based Education means that the curriculum is delivered through community interaction and learning of all possible elements of

the curriculum through our community businesses, vocations, activities, professionals and events instead of the classroom. Somewhat like co-op education, the Academy, and their teachers would work with our community and setup the delivery of the curriculum using our community resources and people. The wonderful part is that it would teach our youth that everything exists within our community to learn about life and to meet the requirements of graduation.

So, we need a 10-12 option immediately. Our choices

are a Private School or a Charter School. While Private

ed by the province with the same funding as Public

Schools are not funded, Charter Schools are fully fund-

School. However, there are a few rules that the Ministry has for opening a Charter School aside from Place-Based Education. One key rule is that the Minister needs to know if our community wants a Charter School. Our parents

need to sign the declarations that say that they are interested and that they would consider the Charter "as an option" for their children's education. The declarations are NOT commitments to enroll in a Charter School that doesn't even exist - the Minister knows that anyone would be crazy to commit to something that hasn't already been set up. But the Minister needs to know that you as a parent would consider sending your children to this Charter School in your community instead of sending your children to our public-school

option in Viking or Tofield. If you have already left the

school division, you have already made that commit-

ment – you would choose something other than the public school system.

Secondary grades 7-9, are going to decline in the K-9 Ryley School for all of the above reasons. If the HRA established the Senior Secondary (10-12) cohort, the community still has the option of public or charter and the Ministry needs the HRA to have 100 students. They can plan to meet that 100 eventually but this would be difficult for our Central Beaver Community with only grades 10-12. Therefore, this is another reason that the HRA has chosen to go with 7-12. Yes, 7-9 will be in competition at least as long as the division keeps 7-9 open. Competition is a good thing for us - the community will have a choice of education for the complete secondary school cohort: 7-12 could be full public, full charter or half-and-half because both will be available. This should make our communities more desirable and with a more robust choice of education, some of those families who have embarked on completely different paths might come back.

So, spread the word and get every parent in our community signing the declaration as soon as possible – time is running out for our opportunity to get a Charter School (a reasonable school zone) in Central Beaver County.



Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) Residential School (1891-1981) Commemoration Project and Reunion events that took place in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in May 2013. This project was the vision of Esketemc (Alkali Lake) Chief Fred Robbins, who is a former student himself. It brought together former students and their families from the Secwepemc, Tsilhqot'in, Southern Dakelh and St'at'imc Nations along with the Cariboo Regional District, the Mayors and municipalities, School Districts and civic organizations in the Cariboo Region.

The events were designed to commemorate the residential school experience, to witness and honour the healing journey of the survivors and their families, and to commit to the ongoing process of reconciliation. Chief Justice Murray Sinclair challenged all of the participants to keep the reconciliation process alive, as a result of the realization that every former student had similar stories.

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of this project. As spokesperson for the Reunion group leading up to the events, former student Phyllis (Jack) Webstad told her story of her first day at residential school when her shiny new orange shirt, bought by her grandmother, was taken from her as a six-year old girl.

The annual Orange Shirt Day on September 30th opens the door to global conversation on all aspects of Residential Schools. It is an opportunity to create meaningful discussion about the effects of Residential Schools and the legacy they have left behind. A discussion all Canadians can tune into and create bridges with each other for reconciliation. A day for survivors

to be reaffirmed that they matter, and so do those that have been affected. Every Child Matters, even if they are an adult, from now on.

The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. It is an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

It all started right in Cariboo, and as a result, School District No. 27 was chosen by the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC) to pilot curriculum changes for all Grade 5 and Grade 10 students reflecting the residential school experience, which have now been implemented province-wide.

Resolutions have been passed in support of Orange Shirt Day by local governments, school districts, and First Nations in the Cariboo and beyond. The AFN Chiefs-in-Council passed a resolution declaring Orange Shirt Day "a first step in reconciliation", and pledging to bring the message home as well as to the government of Canada and the churches responsible, several provincial governments have proclaimed Orange Shirt Day.

On this day of September 30th, we call upon humanity to listen with open ears to the stories of survivors and their families, and to remember those that didn't make it.

Sept. 30 is Orange Shirt Day.


