## Mayors Message

Hello everyone, I hope that everyone is taking in the sunshine and for those that farm you're getting your crops in without any trouble. June is shaping up to be a busy month with the coming of Ryley Sports Day – as you know this year we are adding a Friday night event complete with live music featuring local talent and fun activities for everyone.

As this event is a well-known summer activity, I encourage anyone who is planning family reunions or school reunions to coincide on the same dates; it adds more people to the Village during peak tourism and adds activities for attendees to have more memories to make while they're catching up.

As for Council, May was a busy month with much activity surrounding our independent review of Clean Harbors. The Thurber Engineering report was approved as information and has been made public on the Village of Ryley website for anyone who wishes to take the time to inform themselves. In brief, Thurber's review indicated that the application was very thorough on the part of Clean Harbors, though there are a few details needing clarification.

In addition to this, Council approved the Ryley 2018 Budget Report, and mailed a copy to each household in Ryley. The report is also online on the Village website, and a copy can be obtained at the Village Office for anyone who asks for it. Inside, you'll find a breakdown of revenues and expenditures, a summary of what we have planned this year for our capital budget, and some historical information on what the tax rates have been for the past 14 years. This year, you'll note that the taxes are rolled back to levels lower than 2004, which will mean a savings for many homeowners. It is always a difficult task between finding balance in setting tax rates and being able to provide the high levels of service that residents expect.

Also approved by Council is the summary of the Public Input Survey as well as Council's Strategic Plan. Both documents will be made available on the Village website, and a copy of the survey results will also be mailed out to each household in Ryley so you can hear the good, the bad and the ugly of what some residents had to say. Feedback from the survey was instrumental in helping Council identify priorities for our Strategic Plan, and under our newly approved Public Participation policy, Council commits to conducting a similar survey

every two years to see how the public thinks things are progressing.

Lastly, a big thank you to Beaver County for their support of the 2017 Curling Rink capital project. We appreciate the \$41,650 for the project. It came at an opportune time, as the Village of Ryley, as well as Beaver County, are also contributing \$45,717 and \$41,082 respectively towards the Ryley Pool HVAC project, which will extend the lifespan of Ryley pool for years to come. These decisions support what we heard in the public survey conducted in January; the Village residents support recreation services in Ryley – and so shall Council.

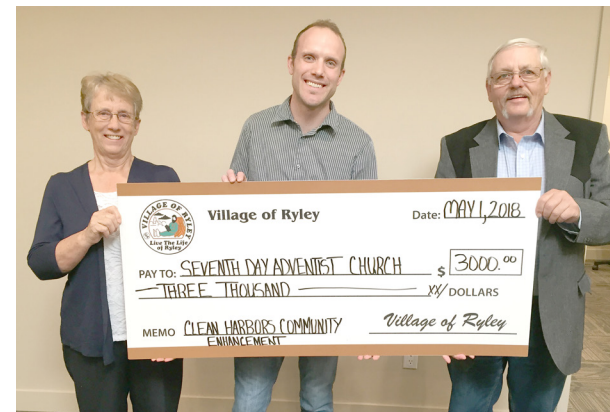

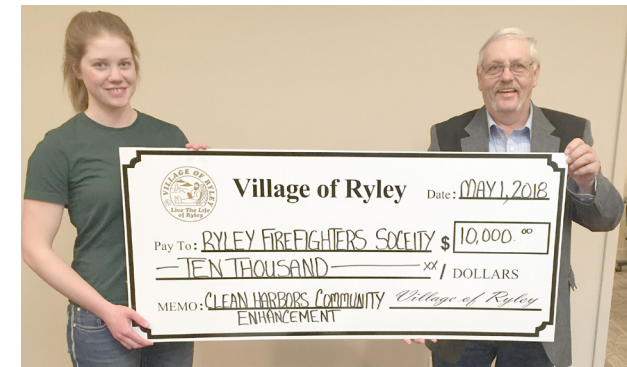

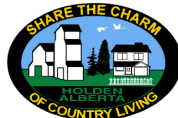
