

VILLAGE OF RYLEY BYLAW No. 2026-1008

**A BYLAW TO AUTHORIZE THE RATES OF TAXATION TO BE
LEVIED AGAINST ASSESSABLE PROPERTY
WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF RYLEY FOR THE 2026 TAXATION YEAR**

Whereas, the Village of Ryley has prepared and adopted detailed estimates of the municipal revenues and expenditures as required by Sections 242 and 245 of the Municipal Government Act, being Chapter M-26 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000, as amended, at a meeting of Council held June 16, 2026; and

Whereas, the estimated municipal expenditures and transfers set out in the budget for the Village of Ryley for 2026 total **\$2,105,332**; and

Whereas, the estimated municipal revenues and transfers from all sources other than taxation is estimated at **\$1,517,142** and the balance of **\$588,190** is to be raised by general municipal taxation; and

Whereas, the requisitions are:

Whereas, the Council of the Village of Ryley is required each year to levy on the assessed value of all assessable property, tax rates sufficient to meet the estimated expenditures and the requisitions; and

Whereas, the Council of the Village of Ryley is authorized to classify assessed property, and to establish different rates of taxation in respect to each class of property, subject to the Municipal Government Act, being Chapter M-26 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000, as amended; and

Whereas, the Council of the Village of Ryley is authorized to establish a minimum amount payable as property tax; and

Whereas, the assessed value of all taxable property in the Village of Ryley as shown on the assessment roll is:

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NOW THEREFORE under the authority of the Municipal Government Act, the Council of the Village of Ryley, in the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. That the Chief Administrative Officer is hereby authorized to levy the following rates of taxation for 2026 on the assessed value of all property as shown on the 2026 Assessment Roll of the Village of Ryley:

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2. That the minimum amount payable as property tax for general municipal purposes shall be \$250 per parcel.
3. That this bylaw shall take effect on the date of the third and final reading and hereby repeals Bylaw 2026-1006.
